

12th INDUSEM General Assembly 2016



















The 12th Annual General Assembly of INDUSEM was held during the Annual INDUSEM World Academic Congress of Emergency Medicine at St. Johns National Academy of Health Sciences, Bengaluru, Karnataka. The heads and members of leadership Councils attended the meetings. The meetings were led by the Leadership of the Academic College of Emergency Experts and the Academy of Clinical Emergency Nursing India. The Summarized Proceedings are presented herewith.

EMCORD2016

The agenda for the meeting was introduced to by Dr. Sagar Galwankar, CEO, INDUSEM. The meeting was chaired by Dr. Bipin Batra, Executive Director, NBE, Dr. K.K. Karla CEO, NABH, Dr. Praveen Aggarwal, Prof. & Head, Emergency Medicine, AIIMS, New Delhi, Dr. Sanjeev Bhoi, Additional Professor JPN Apex trauma centre, AIIMS, New Delhi, and Dr. Vimal Krishnan, Principal Secretary, EMA, India.

The agenda of the meeting Included:

- a. NABH Emerald Quality Certification for Emergency Departments in India
- b. Standardising Faculty Training for Academic Emergency Departments
- c. Advanced skills training for training PG Faculty
- 1. Dr K.K. Kalra presented the NABH Emerald Certification Pathway.
 - Present concerns included how EM departments are manned and the capabilities of these departments to provide acute care. There was a need to standardize the provision of quality emergency care.
 - This was the fundamental of developing the EMERALD Certification.
 - Out of the 80,000 healthcare facilities, only 424 large scale hospitals and 80 small scale hospitals have been accredited by NABH.
 - This Emerald version consists of 8 chapters.
 - All the chapters were discussed in brief.
 - This is the first edition which came out after 2 years of work.
 - Dr. Kalra touched all the major aspects to standardise EM services.
 - There will be an initial assessment followed by a complete assessment after 2 years.
 - 65 -70% compliance of all the standard would entitle for the certification.
 - A few core elements will be identified, which needs to be satisfied by those institutions that go for Emerald certification.
 - Dr. Aggarwal thanked Dr. K.K. Kalra for his initiative and Dr. Sagar Galwankar congratulated NABH for being the first body worldwide to standardise emergency medical services.
- 2. **Dr. Bipin Batra** during his talk stressed on the need to standardise the care given by EM departments in accredited (MD/DNB) teaching institutes. There is diverse ownership of hospitals in India and emergency medicine in India is in a struggling state and it needs more nurturing and recognition. When there is standardisation of these institutions, the public health care will improve drastically. He also pointed the need for two different standardisation system, one for low care system and other for high care system.

There was a query raised in regards to whether an NABH institution would automatically entitle it to NABH EM. Dr Kalra replied back that every institution needs continuous quality improvement. There were also queries whether NABH is optional or mandatory. It was stated that currently it is optional but it would become mandatory later to provide quality care to the patients.

3. The next agenda of the meeting was about faculty development program. This was divided into faculty development, advanced skill development and National Emergency Medicine Board Review of Indian Course (NEMBRIC).

Dr. Praveen Aggarwal introduced the concept of Faculty development program in Emergency Medicine, as it is a major concen for MD and DNB's. MD Emergency Medicine started in 2009 and DNB EM started in 2014. Core curriculum of MD EM is not yet notified by MCI while DNB core curriculum was notified in 2015. There are no set guidelines for training faculty in Emergency Medicine as most of the faculty are from diverse fields. Faculty development program aims at producing quality educators and efficient examiners, evaluators and regulators.

- d. Core of the program is as follows: Tintinalli or any other EM text book could be considered as the standard textbook. Monthly exams would be there followed by final exam. It should cover both theoretical as well as practical aspects.
- e. For faculty with less than 5 years of experience Monthly online tests (Formative examinations) based on pre defined curriculum, each test with 50 multiple choice questions.
- f. For all faculty there will be a final test (summative exam) followed by a five-day contact program (NEMBRIC).
- g. Future trainings would include education, leadership, competency education and communication. Dr. Bipin Batra has agreed for sharing e-module for training.
- h. This program can also be extended to residents with monthly program which will help in creating solid theoretical foundation.

Dr. Sanjeev Bhoi introduced the concept of Advanced Skill Training for faculty. He stressed on the fact that the faculty should know what students have to know. Learning by doing is the best method. Similar program was initiated by the DGHS, Govt. of India and is called the National Emergency Life Support Course (NELS). 86 institutions across the country have enrolled in it. Advanced skills include skills in emergencies related to airway, cardiac, toxicology, GI, renal and trauma. This will also improve research skills. Other programs planned are:

- i. Disaster preparedness and mass casualty management.
- j. Soft skills leadership, ED administration, Microteaching skills and EM examinations.
- k. Communication skills, simulation, research methodology, biostatistics, grant writing, EM health diplomacy.

Dr. Vimal Krishnan introduced National Emergency Medicine Board Review of Indian Course (NEMBRIC), the first official board review course which was endorsed by the NBE and organised by EMA. It was a humongous success. The course format and the objectives achieved were pointed out. The need for all accredited EM residents in India participating in the course was also stressed in the presentation.

4. **The Challenges for Sustainability of EM Programs** were discussed in detail. Dr. Praveen Aggarwal stated that they have taken up the matter with MCI and hopefully, these will be sorted out soon.

- 5. **Dr. Sagar Galwankar** stated that FACEE isn't a degree; it is a membership to the Academic College of Emergency Experts. It will support the official FDP organised by MCI or NBE. ACEE will support the regulatory bodies to improve EM in the country.
- 6. **Dr Sanjeev Bhoi** introduced the concept of student mentor ratio requirement and together with Dr Batra emphasised on the need for optimal student mentor ratio and apprehended all institutes not conforming to it or diluting mentor focus by adding non-accredited EM courses in the same teaching institutes.
- 7. Exam pattern for PG students needs to standardized. Dr. Bipin Batra also stated the requirement of bringing a objectivity in exam, which is easily reproducible, reliable and there should be a validity for the exams.
- 8. **First year post graduate residents** were given an opportunity to express their views after joining Emergency Medicine.
- 9. **Dr. Vimal Krishnan, Principal Secretary**, EMA summarised the meeting and also presented his views as spokesperson for accredited EM Physicians in India
- 10. **Dr. Shankuntala Moorthy** delivered the vote of thanks and urged all the newly graduating residents to stay back in Emergency Medicine itself in our country so that a better system could be established in our country.
