## **The Post**

### **International Fellowship in Emergency Medicine (IFEM)**

This is a middle grade post ideal for international clinicians looking for experience in Emergency Medicine. The Emergency Medicine team at HEFT has an active and extensive training programme for all grades of Doctors and Advanced Clinical Practitioners. The post holder will work alongside other Middle Grade doctors to provide 24-hour cover at our departments on a EWTD compliant full shift rota.

The post attracts 12 sessions (2 sessions are included for professional development). The post is remunerated on agreed national terms.

At HEFT we recognise the importance of our overseas applicants and have a well-established support and development program aimed at this group of doctors. We also have a successful 'buddy' system in place for all new doctors from overseas. The post holders would be expected to work at all 3 sites.

For all posts any candidate who is unable, for personal reasons, to work full time will still be considered for the post. If such a person is appointed, modification of the job content will be discussed on a personal basis. Job share applicants are also welcome.

### **Eligibility Criteria**

The candidates will need to demonstrate interest and capability of working at a middle grade level in the UK Emergency Departments. Previous experience in working in Emergency Medicine is useful.

By the time of appointment, the candidates must have joined the Fellowship Program of the Academic College of Emergency Experts for at least 3 months and have successfully attended the five-day Board Review Course.

After a period of induction training in India, the candidates will have to demonstrate competence by way of simulated exercises prior to taking up post in the UK.

While in UK, they will continue to pursue the ACEE fellowship program.
